12.00 ARRIVAL IN GJIROKASTRA - LUNCH WORKSHOP – PART 1 - FIELD OBSERVATION

• Gjirokastra, a century-old small city in southern Albania (now a UNESCO World Heritage site), provides an outstanding example of a Classical and Late Ottoman urban centre. At the same time, it is a special example of urban and architectural design based on self-defence by individual family units. The old town section is perched on an impressive mountain slope, Mali iGjere", overlooking the Drino River valley, at about 300 metres above sea level. Gjirokastra's domestic architecture comprises more than 500 fine prototypes of kule (in Albanian kulle"), an Ottoman detached tower house, which served the dual purpose of defence and habitation. Mostly built between the seventeenth and nineteenth centuries, Gjirokastra's monumental kule illustrate the disquieting compatibility of vernacular design, sensitive to topography and human needs, and war preparedness.

• Butrint (ancient name Buthrotum) was an important settlement in Hellenistic and Roman times due to its position on the route from Italy to mainland Greece down the Ionian Sea, its safe anchorage, inland access via Lake Butrint and its proximity to Corcyra (Corfu). Butrint, located in the south of Albania approximately 20km from the modern city of Saranda, has a special atmosphere created by a combination of archaeology, monuments and nature in the Mediterranean. With its hinterland it constitutes an exceptional cultural landscape, which has developed organically over many centuries. Butrint is listed by UNESCO as a World Heritage Site.
